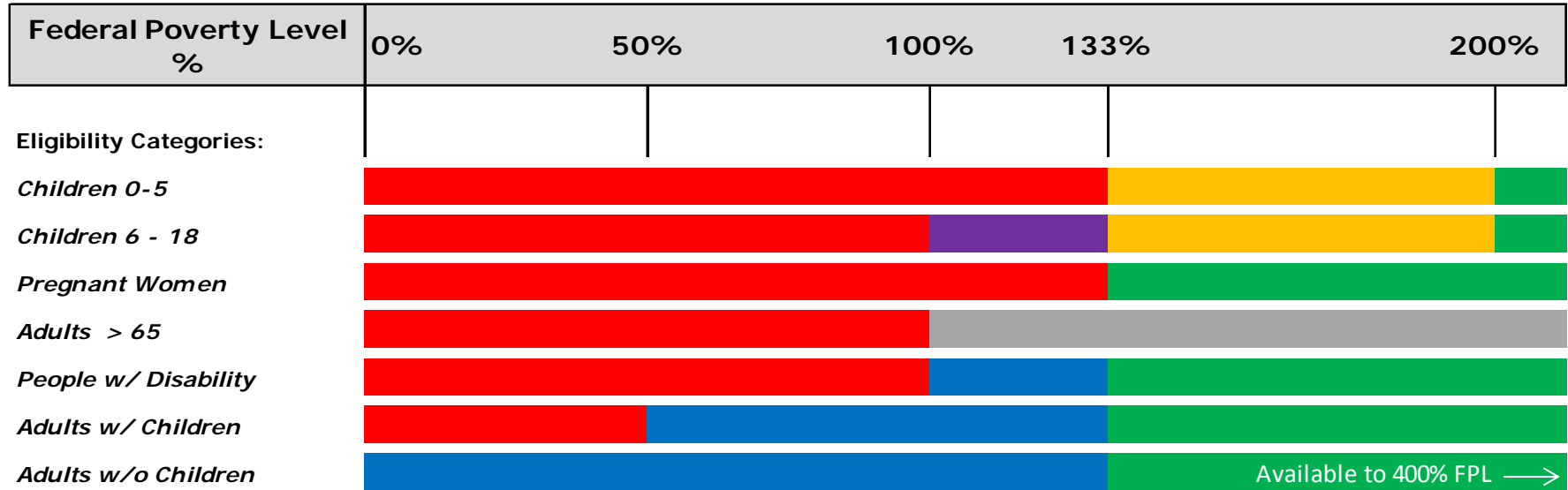

- Preserved existing exchange for small businesses (Avenue H)

Medicaid Eligibility Optional Expansion via the ACA

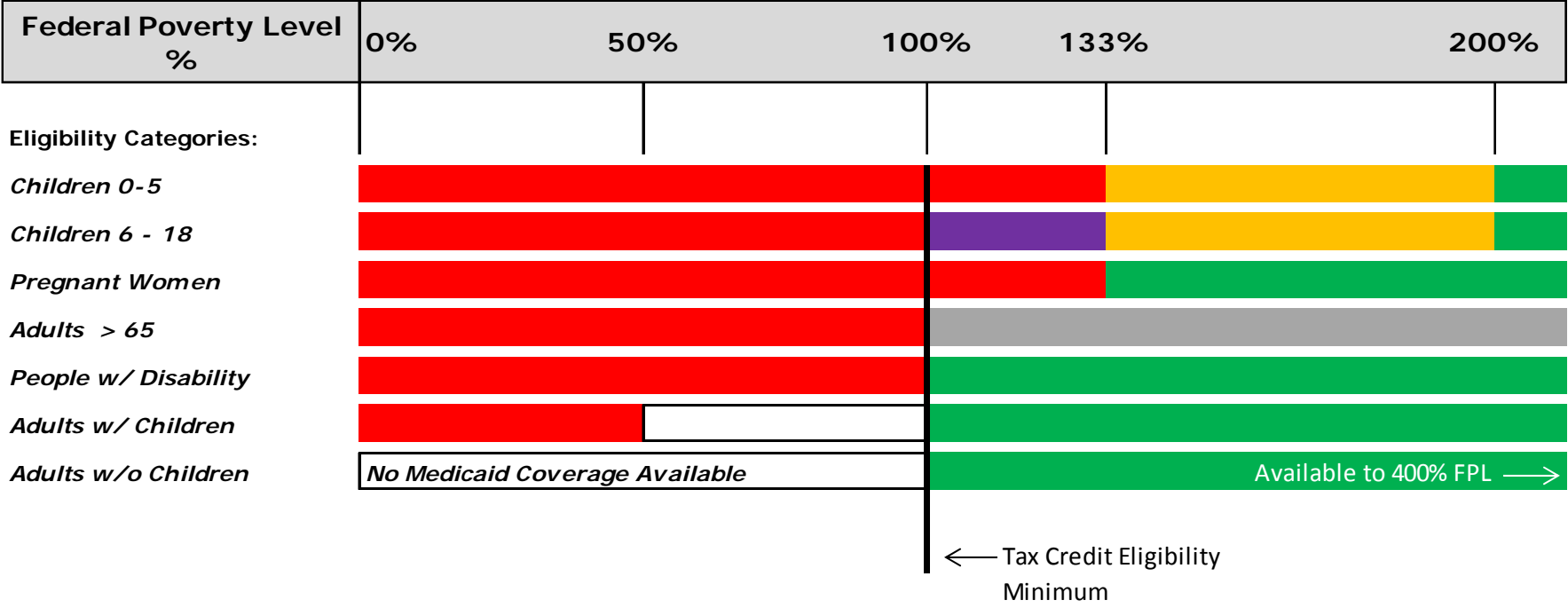


- = current Medicaid eligibility
